1. ENTRY DATES

Entries open at 9:00am Monday 28th August 2023 and close at 5:00pm on Sunday 1st October 2023.

2. GENERAL TERMS & CONDITIONS

2.1. Entries will only be accepted from current financial Professional Members of the CMAA. Membership information is available from www.country.com.au/membership

2.2. All entries must be cleared in writing by the rights holder/s of the chosen recording/s entered.

2.3. Entries will only be accepted from artists or composers who are citizens or permanent residents of Australia or New Zealand.

A permanent resident is defined as someone who:

- is not an Australian or New Zealand citizen or unlawful non-citizen, and
- is usually resident in Australia or New Zealand, and
- holds a permanent visa, a resident return visa, an authority to return or a return endorsement.

2.4. Album Producers, Songwriters, Video Directors or Vocal Collaborators of entered product (specifically in award categories A, B, C, D, H, N and O) who are not citizens or permanent residents of Australia or New Zealand (as outlined in 2.3) are not eligible to win a trophy and are not required to be current financial CMAA members. This does not preclude the album, video or song they worked on from being eligible for entry.

2.5. One entry per category per artist only.

2.6. If the entity entering is a Duo, both members are required to be current financial professional members of the CMAA.

2.7. If the entity entering is a Group (ie more than two members), then a minimum of 50% of the regular members of the Group are required to be current financial professional members of the CMAA (eg a minimum of three members of a five-person Group must be current financial professional members).

2.8. Entry Fees: An initial entry fee of \$70.00 for the first category is payable, and thereafter a fee of \$20 for each additional category entered. GST is payable on all amounts for Australian residents. New Zealand residents are exempt from GST.

2.9. Eligibility and acceptance of entries will be solely at the discretion of the Board of the CMAA. All matters relating to the conduct of the entry, adjudication, and scrutineering processes of the 52nd Country Music Awards of Australia remain under the total control of the Board of the Country Music Association of Australia Inc or its nominee/s. It is the responsibility of the entrant to ensure all entry and eligibility requirements are met. The Board will use its best endeavours to ensure all requirements of entries and conduct of the awards are met but cannot be held responsible for any digression, misunderstanding of entry criteria or non-compliance in any matter.



2.10. Additional evidence relating to commercial release dates and media servicing dates for all entries must be provided to the CMAA upon request following entry. Failure to provide this information may result in disqualification.

2.11. The judging system for the 52nd Country Music Awards of Australia is explained on the CMAA website.

2.12. All companies or persons entering material for the 52nd Country Music Awards of Australia hereby allow recording of the presentation of the Awards ceremony by the organisers or their nominee/s for broadcast on radio, television, video and internet or for transmission by any means whatsoever, in part or in full.

2.13. All entrants are required to provide a current biography (250 words max) and high resolution colour headshot (image must a minimum 300 dpi and no larger than 5MB).

2.14. The results of awards will be final, and no correspondence will be entered into.

2.15. All entrants are bound by and agree to comply with the Rules of the 52nd Country Music Awards of Australia as set out herewith.

2.16. Winners will be announced at the Golden Guitar Awards event in January 2024.

3. CURRENT ELIGIBILITY PERIOD

The current eligibility period for all categories except Top Selling Australian Album is 1st October 2022 to 30th September 2023 inclusive.

4. DEFINITIONS

4.1. ALBUM DEFINITION

Unless otherwise stated, 'Album' means a bundle of no less than seven (7) songs.

4.2. SINGLE DEFINITION

Unless otherwise stated, a 'Single' is defined as:

- a) A single is a song or instrumental recording that is released separately from an album. A single will often appear as a track on a subsequent album release and a track from a released album can be issued as a single.
- b) A recording serviced to media as a 'promotional single' within the current eligibility period.
- c) A recording which has additionally been commercially released (see definition 4.5) in any form during the current eligibility period, or prior to it.

4.3. NEW RECORDING

A 'New Recording' is a new piece of music that has never been commercially released in any form at any time prior to this awards eligibility period.



4.4. NEW WORK

A 'New Work' is defined as being previously unrecorded and original compositions.

The following are NOT considered 'New Work' for the purposes of these awards:

- A cover version or new recording of a previously commercially released song in any form and by any artist (including the entrant);
- New arrangements of traditional works.
- Live recordings of previously released songs.
- Acoustic recordings of previously released songs.
- Demo recordings of previously released song.
- A remix of a previously released song.
- A remix of a Vocal Collaboration with the other "featured" artist/s removed from mix; or
- A remix of a song also with other "featured" artists added to the mix.

4.5. COMMERCIALLY RELEASED

'Commercially Released' is defined as being released for sale or consumption to the general public on a recognised DSP (see section 4.6) or professionally manufactured physical product (minimum of 500 CD units or 100 vinyl units).

4.6. INDUSTRY RECOGNISED DSPs

Industry recognised DSPs include but are not limited to iTunes, Apple Music, Spotify, YouTube, Amazon Music, Tidal and Bandcamp.

5. ALBUM CATEGORY REQUIREMENTS

5.1. There are three genre album categories (categories B, C and D).

5.2. Each award is for an Album (please refer to definition 4.1) that is commercially released (see definition 4.4) for the first time in any form in the current eligibility period.

5.3. Albums will be judged on all aspects including but not limited to song selection, production, artist's performance and musical performance.

5.4. When determining which genre album category to enter, the artist should consider which category, on balance, best suits their entry and enter accordingly.

5.5. An Integrity Panel will assess the entries in all three album categories prior to the first round of judging. If an album is deemed by the Integrity Panel to be unsuitable for that category, a representative of the Golden Guitar Awards administration will contact the artist to advise.

5.6. Artists can only enter their album in ONE of the three genre album categories (categories B, C & D).

5.7. Entrants in album categories B, C and D will additionally be automatically entered in the Toyota Album of the Year category (category A).



5.8. To qualify for album categories A, B, C and D, the following criteria must be met:

- The album must contain no fewer than seven (7) songs.
- 70% of the recordings must be new recordings and new works (see 4.3 and 4.4)
- 50% of the recordings included on the album must have been commercially released for the first time in any form during the current eligibility period (see 4.5 and Section 3)

5.9. Albums featuring producers who are not citizens or permanent residents of Australia or New Zealand are eligible to be entered. Only winners who are citizens or permanent residents of Australia or New Zealand (see definition 2.3) will receive trophies.

6. CATEGORIES & ELIGIBILITY

A TOYOTA ALBUM OF THE YEAR

Albums entered in categories B, C and D will be automatically entered in this category.

Trophies will be presented to the artist and producer; a maximum of two trophies for each category. In the case that the artist is also the producer, one trophy will be awarded.

There are no upload requirements for this category.

B ALT COUNTRY ALBUM OF THE YEAR

Albums entered for consideration in this category should represent the best overall achievement by the performer(s), album producer(s), engineer(s), and songwriter(s). Elements to be considered are the performance, production, and engineering; additional elements for consideration are arrangements and musicianship.

The term Alt Country refers to the broader 'Americana' genre which is defined as music that incorporates, but is not limited to, elements of various American roots music styles, including country, roots-rock, folk, and blues, resulting in a distinctive roots-oriented sound.

Albums entered must be commercially released (see definition 4.5) for the first time in any form in the current eligibility period.

Entries must also comply with the terms and conditions outlined in section 5.

Trophies will be presented to the artist and producer; a maximum of two trophies for each category. In the case that the artist is also the producer, one trophy will be awarded.



B Alt Country Album of the Year Cont:

- All tracks appearing on your album
- Album cover art
- Artist head shot photo
- Artist biography
- Producer head shot photo
- Producer biography
- Commercial release date

C CONTEMPORARY COUNTRY ALBUM OF THE YEAR

Albums entered for consideration in this category should represent the best overall achievement by the performer(s), album producer(s), engineer(s), and songwriter(s). Elements to be considered are the performance, production, and engineering; additional elements for consideration are arrangements and musicianship.

A Contemporary Country Music album primarily incorporates a modern contemporary and/or mainstream country sound drawing influences from but not limited to pop, rock and contemporary R&B music.

Albums entered must be commercially released (see definition 4.5) for the first time in any form in the current eligibility period.

Entries must also comply with the terms and conditions outlined in section 5.

Trophy presented to the artist and producer; a maximum of two trophies for each category. In the case that the artist is also the producer, one trophy will be awarded.

- All tracks appearing on your album
- Album cover art
- Artist head shot photo
- Artist biography
- Producer head shot photo
- Producer biography
- Commercial release date

D TRADITIONAL COUNTRY ALBUM OF THE YEAR

Albums entered for consideration in this category should represent the best overall achievement by the performer(s), album producer(s), engineer(s), and songwriter(s). Elements to be considered are the performance, production, and engineering; additional elements for consideration are arrangements and musicianship.



D Traditional Country Album of the Year Cont:

A Traditional Country Music album primarily draws from styles and influences of previous musical generations. More specifically, to be eligible for this category, the album should be primarily influenced by sub-genres such as, but not limited to western swing, folk, Celtic, classic country, 70s outlaw music, bluegrass, bush ballad, or heritage focused songs.

Albums entered must be commercially released (see definition 4.5) for the first time in any form in the current eligibility period.

Entries must also comply with the terms and conditions outlined in section 5.

Trophy presented to the artist and producer; a maximum of two trophies for each category. In the case that the artist is also the producer, one trophy will be awarded.

UPLOAD REQUIREMENTS:

- All tracks appearing on your album
- Album cover art
- Artist head shot photo
- Artist biography
- Producer head shot photo
- Producer biography
- Commercial release date

E MALE ARTIST OF THE YEAR

This category recognises excellence in performance by a solo male artist.

To qualify for this category, an entrant must submit three (3) new recordings (see definition 4.3), all of which must have been released commercially (see definition 4.5) for the first time in any form in the current eligibility period.

The three tracks may have been released as part of an album or EP, as single tracks, or as a combination of both.

A minimum of two of the three tracks must be a 'new work' as defined in 4.4.

All three of the submitted recordings must feature the entrant only as the lead vocalist and cannot be considered as one of the following:

- A vocal collaboration, in any form, with one or more other artists including any commercial release including a "featured" artist; or
- A re-mix of a song also entered in Vocal Collaboration with the other 'featured' artists removed from mix; or
- A live recording; or
- A re-recording of any previously released song by the entrant in any form, including for example, a new acoustic version, a re-mix release, a new radio edit, a new version with other artists, or a full studio recording; or
- Previously recorded song with new or altered lyrics, arrangement, or melodies; or



E Male Artist of the Year Cont:

 Releases on social media platforms such as TikTok, Twitter, Instagram, Facebook, YouTube, Parlor, Snapchat, Soundcloud or any other platform of a similar nature that are not part of a full commercial release across recognised digital service providers.

An entrant in Male Artist of the Year cannot also enter Group or Duo of the Year (category G) in the same awards year.

One trophy presented to the artist.

UPLOAD REQUIREMENTS:

- Three tracks as per the above
- Commercial release date for each track
- Artist head shot photo
- Artist biography

F FEMALE ARTIST OF THE YEAR

This category recognises excellence in performance by a solo female artist.

To qualify for this category, an entrant must submit three (3) new recordings (see definition 4.3), all of which must have been released commercially (see definition 4.5) for the first time in any form in the current eligibility period.

The three tracks may have been released as part of an album or EP, as single tracks, or as a combination of both.

A minimum of two of the three tracks must be a 'new work' as defined in 4.4.

All three of the submitted recordings must feature the entrant only as the lead vocalist and cannot be considered as one of the following:

- A vocal collaboration, in any form, with one or more other artists including any commercial release including a "featured" artist; or
- A re-mix of a song also entered in Vocal Collaboration with the other 'featured' artists removed from mix; or
- A live recording; or
- A re-recording of any previously released song by the entrant in any form, including for example, a new acoustic version, a re-mix release, a new radio edit, a new version with other artists, or a full studio recording; or
- Previously recorded song with new or altered lyrics, arrangement, or melodies; or
- Releases on social media platforms such as TikTok, Twitter, Instagram, Facebook, YouTube, Parlor, Snapchat, Soundcloud or any other platform of a similar nature that are not part of a full commercial release across recognised digital service providers.



F Female Artist of the Year Cont:

An entrant in Female Artist of the Year cannot also enter Group or Duo of the Year (category G) in the same awards year.

One trophy presented to the artist.

UPLOAD REQUIREMENTS:

- Three tracks as per the above
- Commercial release date for each track
- Artist head shot photo
- Artist biography

G COUNTRY MUSIC CAPITAL NEWS GROUP OR DUO OF THE YEAR

This category recognises excellence in performance by a Group or Duo as defined below.

A Group or Duo is defined as an act, consisting of two or more people, all of whom have recorded, performed, and worked together during the eligibility period such that it would be deemed that the group or duo was their primary project throughout the eligibility period.

To qualify for this category, an entrant must submit three (3) new recordings (see definition 4.3), all of which must have been released commercially (see definition 4.5) for the first time in any form in the current eligibility period.

The three tracks may have been released as part of an album or EP, as single tracks, or as a combination of both.

A minimum of two of the three tracks must be a 'new work' as defined in 4.4.

All three of the submitted recordings must feature the Group or Duo only as the featured artists and cannot be considered as one of the following:

- A vocal collaboration, in any form, with one or more other artists including any commercial release including a "featured" artist; or
- A re-mix of a song also entered in Vocal Collaboration with the other "featured" artists removed from mix; or
- A live recording; or
- A re-recording of any previously released song by the entrant in any form, including for example, a new acoustic version, a re-mix release, a new radio edit, a new version with other artists or a full studio recording; or
- Previously recorded song with new or altered lyrics, arrangement, or melodies; or
- Releases on social media platforms such as TikTok, Twitter, Instagram, Facebook, YouTube, Parlor, Snapchat, Soundcloud or any other platform of a similar nature that are not part of a full commercial release across recognised digital service providers.



G Country Music Capital News Group or Duo of the Year Cont:

An entrant in this Group or Duo of the year category cannot also enter Male Artist of the Year (category E) or Female Artist of the Year (category F) in the same awards year. Similarly, an individual member of a group entered in the Group or Duo of the Year category cannot also enter in either Male Artist of the Year (category E) or Female Artist of the Year (category F).

Please refer to conditions 2.6 and 2.7 for entrant membership requirements.

One trophy presented to the Group or Duo.

UPLOAD REQUIREMENTS:

- Three tracks as per the above
- Commercial release date for each track
- Artist head shot photo
- Artist biography

H VOCAL COLLABORATION OF THE YEAR

Judged on one entered track and recognises artistic excellence in a collaborative vocal performance.

A vocal collaboration is defined as a recording event by two or more people, working together on a 'one off' or occasional vocal collaboration.

The entry must be a new recording (see definition 4.3) and new work (see definition 4.4) which is commercially released (see definition 4.5) the first time in any form (either as an individual track or as part an album) during the current eligibility period.

Each entrant must feature prominently as a lead vocalist, not as a harmony or background singer and must be clearly identified as a featured vocalist on any packaging and label copy.

Individual members of a Group, Band or Duo who are entered in category G (Country Music Capital News Group or Duo of the Year) may be eligible to enter in Vocal Collaboration of the Year provided that:

- there must be one or more additional collaborators featured on the entered recording (and who are not also members of the Group, Band or duo); and
- the entered track is a "one-off" track collaboration.

A minimum of 50% of the artists who perform in the Vocal Collaboration of the Year entry must be citizens or permanent residents of Australia or New Zealand. All entries must meet the membership requirements outlined in 2.3 and 2.4.

Only winners who are citizens or permanent residents of Australia or New Zealand (as outlined in 2.3 and 2.4) will receive trophies.

A maximum of 3 trophies will be presented in this category. Additional trophies may be purchased separately.



H Vocal Collaboration of the Year Cont:

UPLOAD REQUIREMENTS:

- Upload your chosen track (one)
- Artist head shot photo/s all collaborators
- Artist Biographies all collaborators (may be one biography to cover all artists)
- Commercial release date

I BUSH BALLAD OF THE YEAR

Judged on one entered track. This category recognises excellence in performance and songwriting.

A Bush Ballad is a lyrical narrative in song concerned with places, people, events and or attitudes clearly identifiable with Australia.

It must be presented in a traditional manner which exhibits an understanding of the genre's musical and cultural values in the style established by Australia's pioneer performers.

It may combine lyrics previously published as poems or ballads with new music or vice versa, creating a substantially new song.

The Bush Ballad of the Year shall be judged on the submitted recording, not whether or not the performer is a recognised balladeer.

Please note: this category is dedicated to *traditional bush ballads only*. Please ensure that before entering a song in this category you carefully read and understand the criteria above and the following explanation:

'A bush ballad entry must be clearly related in lyrics, form, content, musical arrangement, instrumentation and presentation to the traditional roots of Australian country music as exemplified by pioneers and other early performers.'

Entries in the category of Bush Ballad of the Year will only be accepted provided that the artist and songwriter are Australian or New Zealand citizens.

The entered track must be a new recording and original Australian new work (see definition 4.3 and 4.4) and commercially released (see definition 4.5) for the first time in any form (either as an individual track or as part of an album) during the current eligibility period.

The entry cannot also be entered in Heritage Song of the Year in the same year (category J).

Trophies will be presented to the artist and songwriter; a maximum of two trophies. In the case that the artist is also the songwriter, one trophy will be awarded. Additional trophies are available for purchase separately.

- Upload your chosen track (one)
- Artist head shot photo
- Artist biography



I Bush Ballad of the Year Cont:

- Songwriter head shot photo (if different to Artist)
- Songwriter biography (if different to Artist)
- Commercial release date

J HERITAGE SONG OF THE YEAR

Judged on one entered track. This category recognises excellence in performance and songwriting.

A Heritage Song is an Australian composition that is defined as being about Australia, its people, history, geography, attitudes and ideals and the song and its content must clearly recognise those attributes.

The track cannot also be entered in Bush Ballad of the Year (category I).

The entry must be a new recording and new work (see definition 4.3 and 4.4) which is commercially released (see definition 4.5) for the first time in any form (either as an individual track or as part an album) during the current eligibility period.

Entries in this category will only be accepted provided that the artist and composer are Australian or New Zealand citizens or permanent residents (see definition 2.3).

Trophies will be presented to the artist and songwriter; a maximum of two trophies. In the case that the artist is also the songwriter, one trophy will be awarded. Additional trophies are available for purchase separately.

UPLOAD REQUIREMENTS:

- Upload your chosen track (one)
- Artist head shot photo
- Artist biography
- Songwriter head shot photo (if different to Artist)
- Songwriter biography (if different to Artist)
- Commercial release date

K INSTRUMENTAL OF THE YEAR

Judged on one entered track. This category recognises artistic excellence in an instrumental performance by a solo artist, collaborating artists, duo, or group.

The entry must be a new recording (see definition 4.3) and new work (see definition 4.4) which is commercially released (see definition 4.5) for the first time in any form (either as an individual track or as part of an album) during the current eligibility period.

It cannot include any featured vocal performance.

Entrants in this category must be Australian or New Zealand citizens or permanent residents. International collaborators are not eligible.



K Instrumental of the Year Cont:

One trophy will be presented to the artist.

UPLOAD REQUIREMENTS:

- Upload your chosen track (one)
- Artist head shot photo
- Artist biography
- Commercial release date

L BLUEGRASS RECORDING OF THE YEAR

Judged on one entered track. This category recognises artistic excellence in a bluegrass performance by a solo artist, collaborating artists, established duo, or established group.

An entry for Bluegrass Recording of the Year must feature both vocal and instrumental elements. It must be clearly related in form, musical arrangement, instrumentation, and presentation to the traditional roots of bluegrass music as exemplified by pioneers such as Bill Monroe and Flatt and Scruggs.

Entries are not limited to traditional bluegrass, but so-called progressive bluegrass styles must exhibit and build on an understanding of the genre. The intent is to recognise bluegrass music that remains reminiscent of its culture's legacy while also engaging contemporary forms that might "push the boundaries" but still are relevant in the collective bluegrass music culture.

The entry must be a new recording (see definition 4.3) and new work (see definition 4.4) which is commercially released (see definition 4.5) for the first time in any form (either as an individual track or as part of an album) during the current eligibility period.

Entrants in this category must be Australian or New Zealand citizens or permanent residents. International collaborators are not eligible.

One trophy presented to the artist.

- Upload your chosen track (one)
- Artist head shot photo
- Artist biography
- Commercial release date



M NEW TALENT OF THE YEAR

Judged on one entered track. This category recognises artistic excellence by a solo artist, duo, or group whose eligibility-year release(s) achieved a breakthrough into the public consciousness.

Entries in this category may be:

A new recording (see definition 4.3), commercially released (see definition 4.5)

a) for the first time in any form (either as a single or a track from an album) during the current eligibility period.

OR

 b) a recording officially serviced to media as a 'promotional single' during the current eligibility period, which has been released commercially in any form during the current eligibility period or prior to it.
Please refer to definition 4.2 for additional clarification.

An artist may enter in New Talent of the Year up to five times over a period of five years commencing from and including their first entry year (in any category) in these awards either as an individual or as a member of a duo or group, provided they have not been:

- A finalist in this category more than two times in the past; or
- A previous winner of this category; or
- A finalist in any other category in these awards at any other time.

For example, if an artist enters these awards for the first time in 2020 they are then able to enter this category every year up to and including 2024, provided that the above criteria is met.

Please note that you cannot re-start your years of eligibility if you:

- Are a previously entered solo artist who becomes a member of a new duo or group; or
- Leave a previously entered duo or group and become a solo artist; or
- Leave a previously entered duo or group and become a member of a new duo or group.

All individual members of any entity entered in this category must meet the criteria stated above.

This entry is not required to be a new work (see definition 4.4).

One trophy will be presented to the artist.

- Upload your chosen track (one)
- Artist head shot photo
- Artist biography
- Commercial release date
- Media service date



N SONG OF THE YEAR

Judged on one entered track. This category recognises the written excellence, profession and art of songwriting.

The entry must be a new recording (see definition 4.3) and new work (see definition 4.4) which is commercially released (see definition 4.5) for the first time, in any form (either as an individual track or part of an album) during the current eligibility period.

Entries in the category of Song of the Year will only be accepted provided:

- The recording artist is an Australian or New Zealand citizen or permanent resident.
- A minimum of 50% (one half) of the number of songwriters/composers of the song must be Australian or New Zealand citizens or permanent residents and current financial members of the CMAA. Please refer to section 2.3 and 2.4 for additional clarification.

Songwriters may enter a track in the Song of the Year provided that:

- They have prior written consent from the rights holder/s of the recording (where the artist is someone other than the songwriter)
- They have notified the co-writers of the entry in writing
- The same composition has not been entered by another artist
- The recording must comply with the eligibility criteria for this category.

A maximum of three trophies are presented to the songwriters who are citizens or permanent residents of Australia or New Zealand citizens only.

Additional trophies may be purchased separately.

UPLOAD REQUIREMENTS:

- Upload your chosen track (one)
- Songwriter/s head shot photo
- Songwriter/s biography
- Commercial release date

O CMT MUSIC VIDEO OF THE YEAR

Judged on the entered video clip. This category recognises excellence, creativity and innovation in music videos.

Music video clips must be broadcast for the first time in any form via traditional media broadcast (ie free to air or pay TV) or via industry recognised DSPs (See definition 4.6) in the current eligibility period.

Music videos released during the current eligibility year that are synchronised to a commercially released recording are eligible provided that they are recognised by the artist and/or the record label as the official music video for the individual track. Entries are treated as releases in their own right and are not tied to the release date of the associated audio track.



O CMT Music Video of the Year Cont:

Video clips must be not more than ten minutes in duration, featuring the performance of no more than one song or medley.

Trophies are presented to the artist and video director; a maximum of two trophies presented. In the case that the artist is also the video director, one trophy will be awarded.

P SINGLE OF THE YEAR

Judged on one entered track. This category recognises artistic excellence in performance by a solo artist, collaborating artists, Group or Duo.

The entered track must have been officially serviced to media as a '**single**' during the current eligibility period (refer definition 4.2).

The entry must also have been commercially released (see definition 4.5), in any form as a single during the current eligibility period. It may have been released prior to this eligibility period (Section 3) provided that it has never been released as a **single** (see definition 4.2) and it must have been taken from a commercially released album or EP.

A 'pre-sale' or 'instant gratification' track may be considered a 'single' release providing both the above requirements are met.

The single cannot have been entered in any individual track related category in any previous year.

All entrants in this category must be Australian or New Zealand citizens or permanent residents. Vocal collaborations with international artists are not eligible.

One trophy presented to the artist.

- Artist biography
- Media service date
- Commercial release date



Q TOP SELLING AUSTRALIAN ALBUM OF THE YEAR

Awarded to the highest selling Australian country music album, commercially released for the first time in the 2023 calendar year, based on qualifying criteria and information compiled and supplied by ARIA.

Albums eligible for the Top Selling Album of The Year category must meet ALL of the conditions of Section 5 (ALBUM CATEGORY REQUIREMENTS) on pages 4 and 5 of this Awards Handbook, including that it must contain at least 70% of <u>new works</u> released commercially for the first time, in any form, during the eligibility year (see definition of **new works** in clause 4.4 of the Handbook).

Compilation albums (e.g. albums considered 'Best Of', 'Greatest Hits' or 'Covers' albums) are not eligible for this Award. This includes albums featuring more than 70% of re-recordings, live, acoustic and/or demo recordings, new arrangements, covers and/or remixes of previously recorded material.

One trophy presented to the artist.

There are no upload or entry requirements for this category.

All categories are to be submitted online as follows:
